### **Footprints**

Saturday, December 16, 2006  
8 A.M. - 12:00 P.M.

Park Archeologist, Dr. Jadelyn Moniz Nakamura, will offer a guided hike, 3 miles roundtrip, to the Footprints National Register site in Hawai`i where seminar participants will see "fossilized" footprint features, ancient shelters, trails, and resource procurement areas. Dr. Moniz Nakamura will share stories that will help connect viewers to the Hawaiian people who traveled along a well-used corridor through the Ka'u Desert.

Participants will view the shelters built by weary travelers, learn about the important resources gathered in the area, hear the tragic story of the army of Keoua, and see footprints preserved in the ash material that was ejected during a violent eruption

Participants will meet at the Park's Visitor Center at 8 A.M. to sign in. After check-in, the group will carpool to the Ka'u Desert Trailhead on Highway 11. Participants without Park passes will need to pay Park entry fees.

The walk is easy to moderate. Rain is possible, but most often there are hot, dry, windy conditions. Bring a secure hat, sunscreen, and plenty of water. Bring a lunch or snacks.

The seminar will end at 11:30 A.M. and participants can expect to be back at the Visitor Center by 12:30.
