A Delightful and Most Convincing Visit to Kilauea's Past

Imagine entering an underground chamber that you have passed many times without realizing it was there, to find that it is 1912 and that Kilauea's first Volcanologist, Dr. Thomas Jaggar and his assistant Isabel Maydwell are there to welcome you.

This is precisely what is planned for guests at the Friends' February 11 seminar, **A Lecture and Luncheon with Dr. Thomas Jaggar**. It is one thing to talk about the history of Kilauea, quite another to be transported into the Volcano's past. Upon entering Jaggar's relatively unchanged underground laboratory, the Whitney Vault, it is positively "chicken skin" to find Thomas Jaggar at work there, eager to engage his visitors.

This historical reenactment* is skillfully presented by Peter Charlot, as Thomas Jaggar, and Sandra MacLees, as his assistant Isabel Maydwell. More than 60 shows were performed this past summer for Park visitors. Many Big Island residents have yet to enjoy this audience-interactive drama.

Following their living history immersion, guests will repair to the famed Kilauea Lodge for an elegant luncheon featuring fresh island fare. Joining us for lunch will be Peter Charlot and Sandra MacLees (Dr. Jaggar and Mrs. Maydwell) and Cultural Resources Chief, Laura C. Schuster, one of many Park staff to help revitalize the Whitney Vault.

To fully enter the spirit of the production, guests are invited (but not required) to come in period costume - or to wear some article of early 1900's attire.

The cost of time-travel and luncheon is \$40 for Friends' members and \$50 for non-members. The maximum number of participants is 25. Guests assemble on the front lanai of the Park's Visitor Center at 10:45 A.M.

For those without Park passes, entry fees will apply.
