Pu'uloa Petroglyph Walk

Park Ranger **Andrea Kaawaloa-Okita** will offer a guided hike, 1.5 miles roundtrip, to the largest petroglyph field in Hawai'i, where seminar participants will see hundreds of ancient symbols carved into lava over countless generations. Ranger Andrea will share stories that will help connect viewers to the Hawaiian people who created these beautiful and mysterious images.

*******This is also an opportunity to learn about the plant life in the hot, dry, and windswept coastal lowlands.*******

Seminar participants will meet at the Kilauea Visitor Center to sign in at 7:45 a.m. Park entry fees apply. The group will carpool to the Pu'uloa parking lot, 17 miles down Chain of Craters Road.

The walk is easy to moderate. A mid-morning snack is provided. Rain is possible, but most often there are hot, dry, windy conditions. Please bring:

-  secure hat
-  sunscreen
-  plenty of drinking water

Participants can expect to be back at the visitor center by 12:30 p.m.

The cost of the seminar is \$20 for Friends' members and \$25 for non-members. \$15 and \$20, respectively, are tax-deductible.
