Program

Embark on an ocean tour to see red hot lava in the dark. As early morning's golden sunlight warms the lava-covered coastline, the ultimate in lava viewing unfolds right before your eyes.

An experienced crew founded Lava Ocean Adventures on this very tour due to the fact that the **Sunrise Lava Boat Adventure** is the best for lava, wind, weather, and swell conditions.

The **Sunrise Lava Boat Adventure** allows you to get the sun to your back, which offers many photographic options by lighting the lava and the coast.

Celebrate "Volcano Awareness Month" and see Kilauea's molten rivers of lava reshape the Kalapana coastline and create new black sand beaches, sea cliffs, and lava arches.

Presenter

This trip is led by Lava Ocean Adventures under the guidance of Captain Shane Turpin. Lava Ocean Adventures has been leading trips for over a decade and has dedicated their efforts during the last four years to commercially bringing passengers to see the newest land on the planet.

Details

This experience is rated moderate. Ocean conditions are typically calmer in the early morning, but are of course variable. We will travel in the custom-built lava boat Dream Machine *Lavakai*, a 34 ft. x 10.5 ft. Armstrong Marine built Aluminum Cat powered by 2 Honda 200 hp 4 stroke motors. It is equipped and ready to take you to view molten lava flows up close in all types of sea conditions. Aboard is covered seating for up to 24 passengers per trip. Eighty percent of the covered seating faces forward like a roller coaster. This smooth, exciting ride provides for fun on the water. All necessary safety equipment is provided onboard by Lava Ocean adventures as per Hawai'i State and U.S. Coast Guard requirements.

Please bring:

- Drinking water
- Camera (if desired)
- Binoculars (if desired)
- Personal gear (jacket, raingear, etc.)
