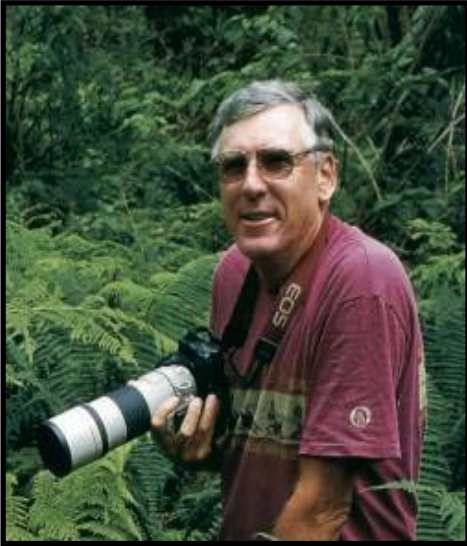

Program

Join award-winning photographer and wildlife biologist Jack Jeffrey for inspirational sessions of photographing the splendor of Hawai'i's native flora and fauna. Learn to photograph birds, plants, flowers, insects, scenics, and other native natural history subjects the way the professionals photograph them. Various aspects of nature photography are discussed, including equipment, exposure, composition, lighting, close-ups, and photo ethics.

Start early in the morning at the top of the Mauna Loa Road within Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park to catch the morning light and maybe native birds feeding on māmane and 'ōhi'a blossoms. We slowly work our way down the road, photographing native koa forest and plants along the way. A short hike around Kīpukapuauulu brings us the opportunity to photograph many rare and endangered plants and, if we are lucky, a Kamehameha butterfly or two. (Due to unpredictable and variable weather conditions, changes in photo sites are possible.) Lunch is included.

Day 1 is designed for those with limited field experience using their cameras. Day 2 is an advanced tip, tricks, and techniques seminar for those who have completed Day 1 or who have some experience with their cameras in the field.

Presenter

A recipient of the prestigious National Sierra Club 2002 Ansel Adams' Award for Conservation Photography, **Jack Jeffrey** contends that "Public awareness is the greatest asset to Hawai'i's imperiled species." His photos have been featured in *Audubon Magazine*, *Smithsonian*, *Life*, *Natural History*, *Birders World*, *National Wildlife*, *Pacific Discovery*, *Defenders of Wildlife*, *Science*, *National Park*, the *National Geographic* & Canon, Inc. endangered species series, as well as in books, text books, and calendars.

Where to Meet

Participants provide their own transportation to Kīpukapuauulu, where we'll park and meet. To get to Kīpukapuauulu (bird park), turn onto Mauna Loa Road from Highway 11 between mile markers 30 and 31. Approximate travel time to Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park from Hilo is 45 minutes and from Kailua-Kona is 2 ½ hours. Details

The experience is rated easy to moderate. The walks, mostly slow-paced, range from 6,600 to 4,000 feet elevation and total about two miles. Be prepared for variable weather conditions.

- 📷 camera gear (lens, tripods, etc. if desired)
- 📷 drinking water
- 📷 hat
- 📷 sunscreen
- 📷 rain gear
- 📷 sturdy walking shoes
- 📷 personal items (e.g., walking stick, binoculars, etc.)

Cost

This event is presented by the Hawai'i Volcanoes Institute, a program of the Friends of Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park, a non-profit organization. For 1 DAY, program cost is \$50 for Friends members (\$40 for "Student" members) and \$70 for non-members. For 2 DAYS, program cost is \$90 for Friends members (\$80 for "Student" members) and \$125 for non-members. Lunch is included in the tuition. Non-members are welcome to join the Friends in order to get the member price.
